What is LeDeR?

LeDeR looks at deaths of people with learning disabilities in England.



About 200-300 people with learning disabilities die each month.



When someone with learning disabilities dies, there is a report about it.

This is called a "REVIEW".



The review is to see whether the person got all the right care and support before they died.

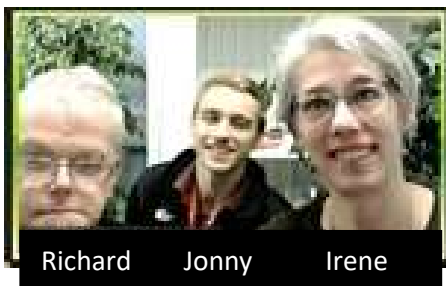
The LeDeR team looks at all the reviews.



The **Staying Alive and Well** group meets once a month on Zoom.

They work at Kingston & St George's University in London.

The group talks about all the reviews of people who have died.

We talk about why they died.

We think about what has gone well for the people who died.

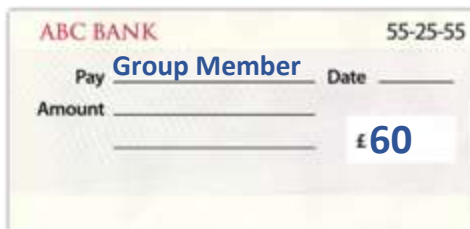


We will give our ideas about how things could have been better.
