- **Jonny Ding** is a researcher without a learning disability.

What do we talk about?

Everyone in the group is interested in doing **research that matters to people with a learning disability.**

We think that research should **include** people with a learning disability.

We **share our experiences, ideas and questions** about:

- Research we have done
- Research we want to do
- How we can do research together with people with a learning disability

Are the meetings recorded?

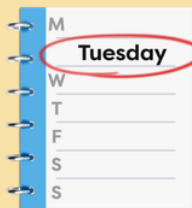
No.
